Four Years

The Parable of the Fig Tree in Luke 13:6–9 says, “There was a certain man which had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none. Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground? And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung it: And if it bear fruit, well: and if not, then after that thou shalt cut it down.”

The Parable of the Fig Tree is the third of three stories found in Luke Thirteen. The first story was about Pilate mingling the blood of Galileans with sacrifices. The second story was about eighteen people who died when the Tower of Siloam fell. The third story was about a Gardener and a Fig Tree. Since the first two stories were real events it's likely the third was too. In other words, Jesus preached four years.

Three Nights

The three days and three nights started when Satan entered Judas. It was the beginning of the sorrows. It was the start of the curse. It was a descent into the heart of the earth, into death itself. It began with the Betrayal on Passover at sunset. It ended with the Resurrection on the First Day of the Week at sunrise. It lasted 60 hours. It spanned three days and three nights.
